The Confederation of Asian and Pacific Accountants (CAPA) representing the regional accountancy profession, is pleased to launch its newest publication, PAOs: Extending Activities into the Public Sector at this event.

PAOs: Extending Activities into the Public Sector is designed to assist professional accountancy organisations (PAOs) consider, develop or strengthen their focus on the public sector. In several countries, PAOs have, to a varying degree, become important influencers and advisors to governments. Similarly, some support a large public sector membership segment. In other jurisdictions, PAO public sector activities are limited. The extent and type of engagement with the public sector, and the pursuit of associated opportunities, will be different in each jurisdiction and will depend on the context within which the PAO operates, the current stage of professionalisation within the public sector, and the PAO's own in-house capacity and expertise.

The publication explores twelve (12) activities that a PAO could undertake across four (4) broad categories:

- Building Demand
- Creating Supply
- Enhancing Skills
- Providing Opportunities

Members of CAPA's Public Sector Financial Management Committee (PSFMC) will provide insight into the activities in the four (4) categories. Brian Blood, CAPA Chief Executive, will take participants through the thinking and discussions that PAOs may find helpful to carry out when assessing or extending their activities into the public sector in the context of their long-term strategic direction.

PURPOSE OF THE WEBINAR


This event provides an opportunity for PAOs to:

- Hear from other commentators on the benefits of PAOs involvement in the public sector


