

PIPFA – the context

Establishme nt

Established in 1993 as an AAT to produce a second tier of professionals

Primary Aims

- Meet the demand for middle level staff to support professional accountants
- Offer a pathway to professional accountancy qualifications

Renamed

Initially established as an AAT, was renamed in year 2000 as PIPFA

Streams

Two Streams: Public Sector and Private Sector

ICAP is exploring the launch of AT certification in Pakistan

Primary purpose is to equip the workforce at the operational level with requisite skills aligned with the international standards
